Student Awards

The Jeffrey Rubinoff Sculpture Park (JRSP) is one of the largest sculpture parks in Canada, and the largest dedicated to the work of a single artist. Covering over fifty hectares on Hornby Island, British Columbia, it contains more than a hundred artworks by the late Jeffrey Rubinoff (1945-2017).

The JRSP has supported the study of art since 2008, with major donations to the University of Cambridge and the University of Victoria, as well as through its ongoing *Company of Ideas* Forums that take place every year on Hornby Island. In early 2017 it endowed an Educational Programme to 'advance the understanding and appreciation of art as a source of knowledge, and to raise awareness of the art of Jeffrey Rubinoff'.

This programme includes an annual student awards scheme for which applications are now being accepted.

Postdoctoral Awards

Aimed at early career researchers anywhere in the world, Postdoctoral Awards offer \$7,000 CAD (roughly \$5,300 USD or £4,100) to support research leading to one or more publications on any subject relating to *art and knowledge*. Themes might include but are not limited to the connections between visual art and: cognition and understanding; ethical or political issues; other fields of knowledge; and the sacred or numinous.

Eligibility and Requirements

- Postdoctoral Awards are open to applicants from any discipline in the Arts or Sciences.
- You are EITHER a graduate student in the latter stages of your PhD degree OR you have submitted your PhD thesis within **three years** of the application deadline.
- The JRSP must be acknowledged in all publications resulting from the Award.
- The JRSP requires copies of any published material to be offered to its archive, and made available for internal consultation and distribution.
- You are required to present your research in person at a *Company of Ideas* Forum, which takes place at the Sculpture Park every June. All travel expenses will be covered.

To apply

Applicants should submit the following:

- Cover letter.
- CV/resumé.
- Name and contact details of one referee.
- Research statement of no more than 1,000 words describing past, current and future research. Please indicate what output(s) will result from the Award.
- A writing sample of no more than 10,000 words (this can be an excerpt from a doctoral dissertation or recent publication).

Graduate Essay Award

The Jeffrey Rubinoff Graduate Essay Award is an annual competition open to current postgraduate students anywhere in the world. Successful applicants will receive \$3,000 CAD (roughly \$2,300 USD or £1,750) to research and write an original essay responding to any aspect of the sculpture of Jeffrey Rubinoff or The Jeffrey Rubinoff Sculpture Park.

Candidates will travel to the Park in June 2019 to conduct initial field research and attend the *Company of Ideas* Forum (24-27 June 2019). They will develop their topic with support from staff at the JRSP, submitting a typed and footnoted essay of 3-4,000 words by Monday 2 December 2019.

They will return to Canada to present their completed essay to the following Forum (scheduled for 22-25 June 2020). All travel expenses will be covered.

Eligibility and Requirements

- Graduate Essay Awards are open to current postgraduate students working in any discipline in the Arts or Sciences.
- The JRSP will archive the finished essay, and may use it for internal consultation and distribution.
- You will be available to travel to Canada in June 2019 and June 2020.

To apply

Applicants should submit the following:

- Cover letter (Please indicate your suitability for the Award, and describe what initially interests you about the sculpture or the Sculpture Park).
- CV/resumé.
- A writing sample of up to 10,000 words (this can be an essay or dissertation).
- Name and contact details of one academic referee.

Guest Curatorship

The 2019 Guest Curatorship Award is targeted at undergraduate or postgraduate students **living on Vancouver Island or the Gulf Islands and attending a Vancouver Island post-secondary institution**. The 2019 Guest Curator will assist the Sculpture Park's Curator in enhancing the Park's online presence.

The project: In 2019 the JRSP website will be completely redesigned, with an emphasis on making multimedia materials available to the public in an attractive and explicative manner. The Guest Curator will assist the JRSP Managing Curator to design an online multimedia gallery of sculpture photos, tour and lecture videos, and symposium podcasts. The successful candidate will then organize, edit and upload the existing multimedia. Images will need cataloguing, and audio and visual media will need to be trimmed and labeled. The work will be part-time, and can be combined with studies. It will be completed between February and May 2019 on a mutually agreed schedule, and will involve up to two expenses-paid trips to Hornby Island. The candidate will also attend the 2019 *Company of Ideas* Forum, on 24-27 June 2019.

The successful candidate will receive an award of \$2,000 CAD, plus travel expenses and required software.

Desired background: Knowledge of video, audio and photo editing software; some knowledge of website content systems such as WordPress and principles of good online design; interest in and knowledge of visual art.

Eligibility and Requirements

- The Guest Curatorship is open to applicants from any discipline in the Arts or Sciences.
- You are EITHER a current undergraduate or postgraduate student at a Vancouver Island post-secondary institution OR you have graduated from such an institution **within one year** of the application deadline.
- You reside on Vancouver Island or one of the Gulf Islands.

- You are available for up to two site visits to Hornby Island between February and May 2019.
- You are able to commit to completing the work by May 2019.
- You must have a laptop and internet connection capable of managing multimedia files.
- You are able to attend the *Company of Ideas* Forum, which will take place at the Sculpture Park 24-27 June 2019.

Applicants should submit the following:

- CV/resumé listing relevant projects or studies.
- Name and contact details of one referee.
- A cover letter (of no more than 1,000 words) answering the following questions:
 1. Why do you want the position?
 2. What is your relevant experience?
 - Knowledge of video, audio and photo editing software.
 - Knowledge of website content systems such as WordPress, and principles of good online design.
 - Interest in and knowledge of visual art.
 3. Do you have specific ideas for the online gallery? (Optional)
 4. What is your availability during the period February to May 2019?
 5. Are any periods from February to May that you will NOT be able to work on the project?
 6. Can you attend the *Company of Ideas* Forum (24-27 June 2019)?
 7. Name and contact details of one employment or academic reference.
